Pastoral Letter

"The Chosen" - A bible study for July

The Chosen started in 2021 as a Crowdfunded online TV series about Jesus. Since its small beginnings it has become hugely popular, with great reviews from Christians throughout the world. In particular, Stuart Bloor, our Churchwarden from Christ Church, has found it to portray a wonderful Jesus, and it has been hugely helpful to him in his growth in faith and Christian journey.

The director of The Chosen aims to bring together the 4 gospel accounts of Jesus, into the one story, and also to try to see Jesus through the eyes of the people that knew him. So, it's a creative bible based telling of the life of Jesus. The series has a huge worldwide following and the good news is that it is now available on DVD.

In season 1 we see Jesus invite people from different backgrounds to join his group of followers. As Jesus performs his first miracles, he calls Mary Magdalene; the stonemason Thaddeus; the choir member Little James; the fishermen Simon, Andrew, James, and John; the caterer Thomas and vintner Ramah; and the tax collector Matthew to follow him.

I've found a Bible study linked to The Chosen, called "What does it mean to be Chosen?". The bible study looks interesting, and we're invited to watch the first four episodes of Season 1, and to learn about and discuss:

You are called.

You rest.

Jane xx

You are cherished.

You change course.

The course links to the various Episodes, the gospels and Isaiah chapter 43. The course blurb explains "Being chosen by Jesus has beautiful and far-reaching implications – although it says more about the Chooser than the chooses. We are loved because He is love. We are saved because he is merciful. We belong to the family of God because Jesus invites us, making the Bible and all it's promises as true for us today as it was for God's chosen nation" Everyone is welcome to join me at The Vicarage (163 Crewe Road, Haslington), on the Thursday evenings in July, at 7.00pm. We'd begin on 4th July and conclude on 25th July. I hope you can come, bring a friend. With every blessing

In Fellowship

Strawberry almond cake

Ingredients

175g butter, softened 175g golden caster sugar 2 medium eggs 175g ground almonds 175g self-raising flour 1tsp ground cinnamon 500g strawberries, hulled and



Method

Set the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4 and line the 23cm cake tin with greaseproof paper.

Beat the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs and 2tbsps warm water. Mix in nuts, flour and spice.

Spread half the mixture in the tin to the edges. Place most of the strawberries on top (reserve a few small halves), then spread the rest of the cake mixture on top and scatter with the rest of the fruit.

Bake for about 1 hour 10 minutes. Check after an hour, and if it's getting too brown, cover with paper. Cool in the tin for 10 minutes, then loosen edges with a knife. Slide cake onto a plate and dust with icing sugar. Serve warm or cooled, with cream or yogurt.

If you wish you can set the strawberries upright to represent the flames of the holy spirit this will then be a Pentecost-themed almond cake.


