## *Pastoral Letter*

### **St Barnabas – Son of Encouragement**

*"Barnabas" means "son of encouragement" – what a wonderful way to be known.*

The feast day of St Barnabas is celebrated on 11<sup>th</sup> June. Barnabas has always been one of my favorite figures in the New Testament, perhaps especially because of the wonderful meaning of his name. In the Acts of the Apostles we are told that his real name was Joseph, but the apostles gave him the nickname Barnabas, which means "son of encouragement." What a beautiful thing to be known for! Imagine if people described us as someone who encourages others. Barnabas appears early in the life of the first Christian community in Jerusalem. One of the things we learn about him is his generosity. He sold a field he owned and brought the money to support the needs of the early church. This simple act tells us something important about him: Barnabas was someone who believed deeply in the life of the Christian community and wanted to strengthen it. But Barnabas is perhaps most famous for something else: he was the person who believed in Paul when others were afraid of him. When Saul (later known as Paul) first became a Christian, many believers were understandably cautious because Saul had previously persecuted Christians. Yet Barnabas took a risk; he welcomed Paul, introduced him to the apostles, and spoke on his behalf. Without Barnabas, Paul's ministry might have taken different path. Barnabas saw potential where others saw danger. He encouraged someone who would go on to become one of the greatest missionaries of the early Church. Barnabas continued to play an important role in the spread of the gospel. He travelled with Paul on missionary journeys and helped nurture new Christian communities. Wherever he went, he strengthened the faith of others. The story of Barnabas reminds us that encouragement is a powerful ministry; every one of us can encourage someone else. A word of affirmation, an act of generosity, or a willingness to believe in someone when others hesitate – these are all ways in which the Spirit of God works through us.

In a world where criticism and discouragement can sometimes seem all too common, the Church is called to be a place where encouragement flourishes. Perhaps we might ask ourselves; who might God be calling us to encourage? Barnabas reminds us that encouragement can change lives.

## Coventry God Cakes,

### Ingredients

- 1 x 475g ready-rolled ready-made puff pastry
- 300g mincemeat
- 1 egg white, whisked with a teaspoon of water
- Caster sugar
- 1 tablespoon rum (optional)



### Method

Preheat oven to 220C/200C Fan/400F. Line a large baking tray with baking paper.

Unroll the puff pastry and cut it into equal squares - such as 2" (5cms) squares or larger for bigger pies.

Place 1 to 2 heaped teaspoons of mincemeat on the middle, brush all 4 sides with a little water and fold the pastry over to form a triangular shape pasty.

Brush the tops of each one with the egg white and sprinkle the sugar over the top.

Place them on the baking tray and bake in preheated oven for 12 to 15 minutes until they are puffed up and golden brown.

Serve warm with cream, brandy or rum butter.

If adding the rum, mix into the mincemeat before adding the filling.

Coventry God Cakes, a traditional regional recipe from The Midlands in England. Traditionally given by godparents to their god children on their confirmation, or at Easter, the triangular shape and markings is said to represent The Holy Trinity

## **Church Hall Refurbishment Report**

The church hall refurbishment project is progressing well, with several key improvements scheduled for the coming months. The works are aimed at enhancing the building's facilities, improving energy efficiency, and ensuring a more comfortable environment for all users of the hall.

A major element of the project is the installation of new double-glazed windows, which is scheduled to take place in June.
