## *Pastoral Letter*

**Happy Easter! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

**Jesus has defeated sin and death.**

Death has always been seen by us as an enemy. As the writer Julian Barnes put it: "Death never lets you down, it remains on call seven days a week. And is happy to work three consecutive night shifts. You would buy shares in it if they were available". But the resurrection of Jesus assures us that even though death is still an enemy, it is now a defeated enemy.

Easter is the day death died, and we have the assurance that heaven awaits. There is life after death, a life we hardly dared hope for, and the context is nothing less than a new heaven and a new earth, with Christ at the centre. It's hard to hold on to such a fantastic vision in a culture that desperately tries to avoid death. But there it is. In such a culture, the resurrection is a blast of fresh air. Death is irrevocably defeated.

It looked pretty grim that Good Friday night. Jesus was a bloody corpse in a grave; the disciples were hiding; the women were shell shocked, knowing only that they must buy spices for the body. It was all disastrous: the Jesus dream was shattered. But on the third day all that was reversed. Very soon, those believers came to see that the cross had not been a brutal defeat after all, but a glorious victory.

It is easy to see that it was a victory over death because Jesus was alive, but what about a victory over sin? Sin was present in all sorts of miserable ways on the cross; so much evil was being unleashed on Jesus - the hatred, cruelty and violence of the perpetrators, the lust for power, the corruption of leaders, the selfishness, the arrogance and vanity of humankind, the shoddiness of religion. It was all thrown at Jesus. And Jesus took it without flinching, absorbed it without reproach. He returned love for hate, forgiveness for cruelty. He took it into himself, soaked it up, and so, in a sense, he disarmed the powers of darkness at their strongest point. Love conquered.

**Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

## Chocolate mint loaf cake

### Ingredients

2 x 85g salted butter plus extra for greasing  
2 x 50g dark chocolate broken into pieces  
2 x 120g plain flour  
2 x 140 golden caster sugar  
6 tbsp cocoa  
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda  
2 large eggs  
284ml carton buttermilk

### For the icing

300g box After Eights broken  
50ml double cream To decorate  
turquoise food colouring  
300g Regal-Ice Ready to Roll icing  
1 tsp peppermint extract



### Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Grease and line the base and sides of a 22cm square tin. Melt 85g butter and 50g chocolate together in a small pan. Mix 120g flour, 140g sugar, 3 tbsp of the cocoa and ½ tsp bicarbonate in a bowl.

Whisk together 1 egg with half the buttermilk (about 140ml). Scrape the melted chocolate mixture and egg mixture into the dry ingredients, along with 100ml boiling water. Whizz briefly with an electric whisk until lump-free. Scrape into the tin and bake for 18-20 mins until a skewer comes out clean.

Cool the cake in the tin for 15 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to finish cooling while you repeat steps 1 and 2 to make a second cake. Cool both completely.

To make the icing, melt the After Eights and cream together in a saucepan. Cool, then chill until spreadable.

## Church Hall Refurb Project.



It's been talked about for years with discussions ranging from knock it down and build a new one to there's nothing wrong that a coat of paint wouldn't fix. A coat of paint wouldn't address the inefficiencies of the building resulting in expensive running costs, building a new one even with grant aid is cost prohibitive.

We have opted for a targeted approach to bring the current structure up to modern standards in stages as funds allow.

Some of the tasks identified are:

Upgrade the lighting: Install LED lighting.

Replace the Emergency exits: Replace the rotten frames and install better insulated doors.

Install loft insulation: There is none at the moment.

Replace the windows with double glazed units.

Replace the rotten fascias.

Improve the wall insulation.

Upgrade the toilets.

March saw the beginning of the work with the old fluorescent light fittings replaced by LED panels.

We had replaced 2 of the old fittings when they failed with LED strip lights, and these fittings have not been wasted, they are now in the storage areas. The electricians were in for a day and even fixed the ceiling tiles that were out of place.

We have collected quotes for the emergency exits and have applied for some funding towards the cost, and hopefully this job will be completed next.

*Cont. from Pg 9. Cake Recipe*

Trim the cake edges, then halve to make 4 rectangles. Use half of the icing to sandwich the layers together, then spread the rest over the top and sides. Chill.

Knead some colouring into the ready-to-roll icing with the peppermint extract.

Roll out on an icing sugar dusted surface, then lift over to cover the cake, smoothing with your hands. Trim excess icing, then scatter with decorations.

Chill again for 1 hr to firm up, then serve or keep in the fridge, removing 30 mins before serving.
