

### Pastoral Letter

#### Jesus The Transformer

Jesus took fishermen, zealots, tax collectors, and prostitutes and changed them into people who rose up and changed their world with a message of transformation. Christian transformation is so important because without it we are just another of a wide variety of religions. We have no power. It is because of the promise that if a person is in Christ, they will become a new creation, that makes the Christian message so different.

It is not about man trying to be good. It is about God coming to live inside of man and that because of that reality, the man is changed from the inside out.

There is no such thing as inevitability when it comes to the transforming power of Jesus. When the church preaches the message of the cross and the power of the resurrection, then we have the real answer to the ills of this world.

Instead of being against something, we will be for something. We will be for changed and transformed lives!

Now that is something to think about!

#### Christian Transformation Was the Ministry of Christ.

One of the many instances where Jesus took somebody who was born a certain way and transformed him into something else. It is the story found in Mark's gospel chapter 8 and it goes like this.

#### Mark 8:22—26 New Living Translation (NLT) Jesus Heals a Blind Man

22 When they arrived at Bethsaida, some people brought a blind man to Jesus, and they begged him to touch the man, and heal him. 23 Jesus took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the village. Then, spitting on the man's eyes, he laid his hands on him and asked," Can you see anything now?" 24 The man looked around." Yes," he said," I see people, but I can't see them very clearly. They look like trees walking around." 25 Then Jesus placed his hands on the man's eyes again, and his eyes were opened. His sight was completely restored, and he could see everything clearly. 26 Jesus sent him away, saying," Don't go back into the village on your way home."

Here is an instance where we see physical healing that transformed a blind man's life. It may be that the man was not born blind, the passage doesn't say, but regardless he was totally incapable of changing what was. He was blind. There was nothing he could do about it. Yet Jesus transformed his life!

In this passage, we actually see that even Jesus had to pray for someone more than once before they were healed.

#### Cont.

If it happened to Jesus, then what makes us think that we only have to pray once? Many times, healings, whether spiritual, emotional, or physical are progressive and take time.

There is a deeper message in this passage as well. It has to do with the fact that Jesus came to set at liberty those who are captive.

#### Luke 4:18 New Living Translation (NLT)

18" The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released, that the blind will see, that the oppressed will be set free,

The principle is that Jesus came to change lives. He came to transform them. He did not come to leave them the same.

Somehow this message has been lost!

# Epiphany cake

### Ingredients

750g rough puff pastry

100g caster sugar

100g unsalted butter at room temperature diced quite small

100g ground almonds

2 large eggs plus an egg yolk for glazing

1 teaspoon of almond extract

1 tablespoon of brandy or rum or milk

1 glacé cherry or sultan or raisin



Preheat the oven to 200c or fan oven 180c or gas mark 6.

Cream together the sugar and butter until light and fluffy and gradually add the eggs. Mix in the ground almonds, almond extract and brandy, rum or milk and of course the cherry or sultana, mix to a smooth paste.

Halve the pastry and roll each half out to a thickness of approximately 3-5 mm. Using a 25 cm's circle (use a dinner plate or the base of a spring form tin) cut two circles. If one is slightly smaller than the other that will work well.

Place the slightly smaller circle on a baking tray lined with baking parchment, brush the edge with the egg yolk beaten with a teaspoon of water.

Place the frangipane filling in the centre and spread out to within 1 cm of the edge. Put the second ring of pastry on top of the filling and seal the edge with your fingers or the back of a fork.

Using a sharp knife, score a series of lines on top of the pastry to form a spiral. Brush with the remaining egg wash and bake for approx. 30 mins until the top is golden brown and puffed up.

Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 5 minutes, then move to a wire rack. Serve just warm or cold.

The story is that the three kings arrived at the stable in Bethlehem on the twelfth night bearing the gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. To honour this, a pie was created known as a Galette des Rois. It really isn't difficult to make as it consists of puff pastry enclosing an almond frangipane. When it is baked it is decorated with a paper crown! Traditionally a small silver trinket is placed inside the frangipane, and the person who gets the trinket in their slice can wear the crown for the day. Considering the price of dentistry these days I wouldn't risk putting something hard in the frangipane so put a cherry or a sultana in instead!
