The Summary of the Law

Preparation of the Table

Generous God, creator, redeemer, sustainer, at your table we present this money, symbol of the work you have given us to do; us it, use us, in the service of your world to the glory of you name. Amen

We join with them in heaven's song:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of you glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

(Please sit)

Father of all, we give you thanks for every gift that comes from heaven.

To the darkness Jesus came as your light. With sings of faith and words of hope he touched untouchables with love and washed the guilty clean.

The crowds came out to see your Son, yet at the end they turned on him.

On the night he was betrayed

he came to table with friends to celebrate the freedom of your people.

Jesus blessed you, Father, for the food; he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said: This is my body, given for you all. Do this in remembrance of me. *(bells)*

Jesus then gave thanks for the wine; he took the cup, gave it and said: This is my blood, shed for you all for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me. *(bells)*

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate the cross on which he died to set us free. Defying death he rose again and is alive with you to plead for us and all the world.

Send your Spirit on us now that by these gifts we may feed on Christ with opened eyes and hearts on fire.

May we and all who share this food offer ourselves to live for you and be welcomed at your feast in heaven where all creation worships you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen
