Pastoral Letter

The YMCA in Crewe.

Like many of you, I've driven past the YMCA Crewe building, on Gresty Road, many times, with little appreciation of the sort of work they do and how they support needy people in our community. In fact, now I think of it, my understanding of the YMCA is shaped loosely by the "the song", Y.M.C.A 1978 by The Village People, and my long-ago experiences of an aerobics class at the YMCA in Birkenhead. For some people, the song Y.M.C.A is an anthem for the LGBTQ+, many of whom would have found, and would find today, support and understanding from the YMCA. Others see the song an invitation to simply hang out with others, maybe through playing basketball or volleyball – both of which the YMCA invented!

At Deanery Synod we heard form Mark Hills, Chief Executive Officer of the YMCA Crewe, as he spoke about his life with the YMCA and future vision for the YMCA. Mark's father, turned aside from his career in medicine, to work full time for the YMCA, and Mark has inherited his father's vision and passion. The YMCA, founded in 1844, is now found in 120 countries and has 65 million members, there are 83 YMCAs in this country. Under Mark's leadership, YMCA Crewe is becoming YMCA Cheshire, and so naming its widening scope and ambition to help and support people in need. YMCA Cheshire is an inclusive Christian organisation, and works with many faith groups, businesses and other organisations, to provide support and accommodation for local people experiencing homelessness, for care leavers, unaccompanied asylum-seeking children and refugees. They provide a lot of opportunities for personal development, and a range of community activities for children, families and the socially isolated.

YMCA Cheshire believes "Everyone deserves the chance to discover who they are and what they become", and part of Crewe's context is a shocking level of child poverty. But we can make a difference because with the YMCA there's much scope for voluntary work, charitable giving and prayer. If you'd like to know more, then there is an open invitation to the GLO Café at Gresty Road, CW2 6EL We Pray:

In Fellowship

Fresh Strawberry Cake

Ingredients

210grms plain flour 1½ teaspoons baking powder ½ teaspoon salt 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened, plus more for greasing the tin 200grms plus 2 tablespoons sugar, divided 1 large egg 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 120ml milk About 350grms strawberries, hulled and halved



Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350°F and butter a 9-inch deep dish pie tin (or 9-inch round cake tin).

In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside.

In the bowl of an electric mixer, beat the butter and 200grms of the sugar until pale and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the egg and vanilla and beat on low speed until well combined. Gradually add the flour mixture, alternating with the milk, and beat on low speed until smooth. (Note: the batter will be thick.)

Transfer the batter to the prepared tin and smooth with a spatula. Arrange the strawberries on top, cut side down, so that they completely cover the batter (the recipe calls for approximately 350grms of strawberries; use more or less if necessary). Sprinkle the remaining 2 tablespoons of sugar over the strawberries.

Bake for ten minutes, then reduce the heat to 325°F and bake until the cake is lightly golden and a tester comes out clean, about an hour. Let the cake cool in the tin on a rack. Serve with sweetened whipped cream or vanilla ice cream, if desired.
